### YOUTH ALIYAH INTERVIEWS THE JURY

### THE QUESTION

Having visited Israel and seen Youth Aliyah work at first hand, how would you describe Winnipeg Jewry's obligation in this task?

### THE REPLIES

**MRS. SAM KANCE** — The helpless, homeless and oppressed children from the ghettos of North Africa and Iraq are as much our responsibility as is any Western Canadian Jewish youngster in need. Israel is doing our work . . . and doing it magnificently . . . when she takes these to her heart and builds them into strong, healthy young men and women. All the suffering and anxiety that goes into child rearing is hers alone . . . all we are asked to do is give her the material things, the food, clothing and four walls that she builds into a home. Certainly, that is little enough.

**MRS. D. P. GOTTLIEB** — To give a "capsule" view on Youth Aliyah is an impossible task after seeing the miraculous transformations in character, mind and body they work. To call it the greatest bargain in human values is an understatement. And yet these efforts are conducted under conditions beset by so many difficulties (mostly of a financial nature). There aren't enough shoes, or bunks, or dormitories or school equipment. Love, affection, skilled care, devoted training . . . these alone are not rationed. And these, at a distance of six thousand miles, we can only express through tangible, practical gifts. Let us not be stinting in our small share of the burden.

**MRS. DAVID FREED** — The 'Sabras' in Israel is a new type of Jewish youth. His spirit, his courage, his devotion to his people and love of his land are all thrilling to see. And yet the tourist is surprised to find that so many 'Sabras' are not born in Israel. They are from Yemen, Bulgaria, Germany . . . all over the world. But it was their Youth Aliyah upbringing that not only saved their very lives . . . but saved their character for us too. No one will ever know how much the survival of Israel owes to the gallantry of these young men and women. No mother in Israel, or here, can harden her heart against their needs. Our pride in them obligates us to help make the same care possible for thousands upon thousands of additional Youth Aliyah children looking to us for aid today.

**MRS. C. O. SWARTZ** — In Israel you learn that Jews are a varied people. You sometimes wonder . . . 'can they be my brothers?' . . . those whose living conditions seem ages removed from ours. And yet the younger generation in Israel seems so much more progressive, alert, capable . . . familiar to us. This is because so many thousands of them have been exposed to the care, homes, schools, and training of Youth Aliyah institutions. A child from a professor's home in Berlin and from a Moroccan ghetto will together build our Jewish nation, with equality of opportunity to develop their God-given talents, all because of Youth Aliyah. No price should be too high to pay for such human reconstruction.

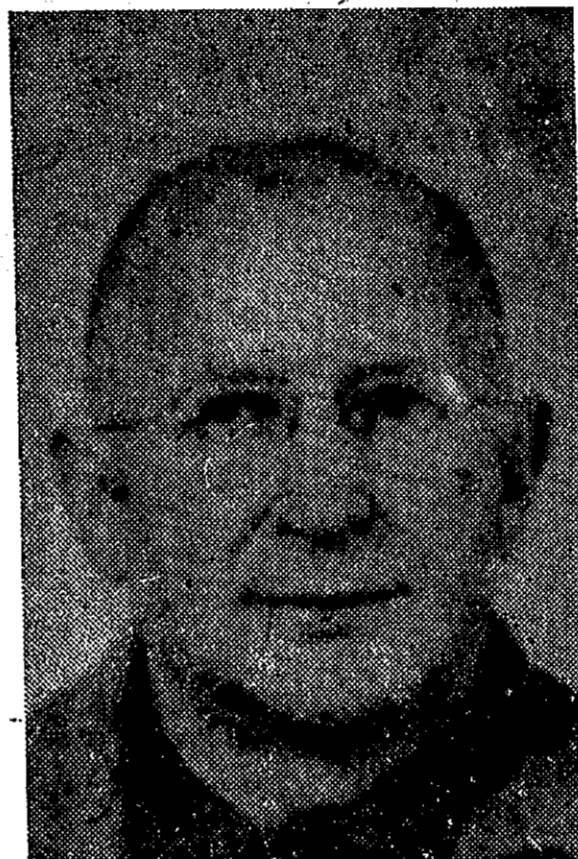

his shirt . . . in a stage whisper that reached round the theatre, mingled with awe, pride and delight: "Look, mommy . . . he's a Jew!"

Again on David and Bathsheba, although we felt the scene of David recting one of his Palms was a gem, we would not recommend that the Chevre Tehillim of North End synagogues attend the film. Gregory Peck's features are passible for a Semite . . . but Bathsheba is a far cry from an oriental.

Minor constructive criticism: no one objects to a few words of French, Italian or Choctaw in Hollywood films in those settings.

Why could we not hear even the word 'Shalom' or a single line of a Psalm in Hebrew, just for the sake of flavor.

Summing up, it was a 100 per cent improvement over Samson and Delilah, as far as Biblical films go . . . but not too successful as a full portrait of David, which it never set out to be.

The 1891 agreement under which London and Cairo divvied up the Sudan is known as the 'Anglo-Egyptian Condominium.' From the direction of events today, we would call all British Near East upsets more of a Pandemonium

than a Condominium. Our cue for viewing serious events with such levity comes from Churchill who says the Labor Party's three big troubles are Abadan, Sudan, and Bevan.

Speaking of troubles, while the Republican National Committee's Gabrielson was no angel, the Democrats were Boyle-ing in hot water.
