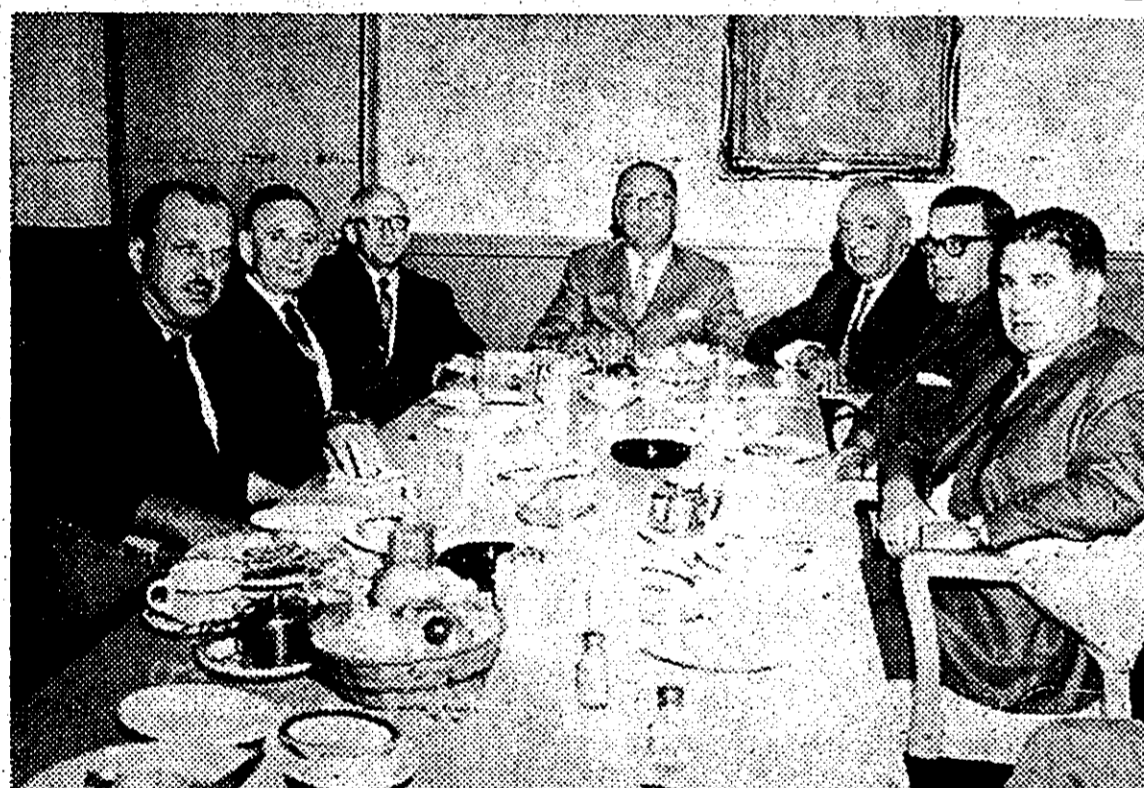


Israel Bond Campaign Launched at "Chai" Dinner

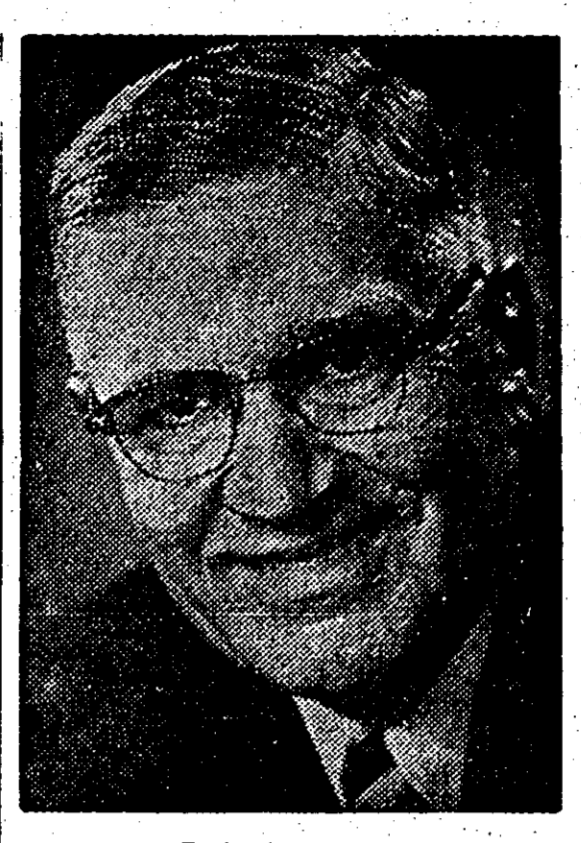

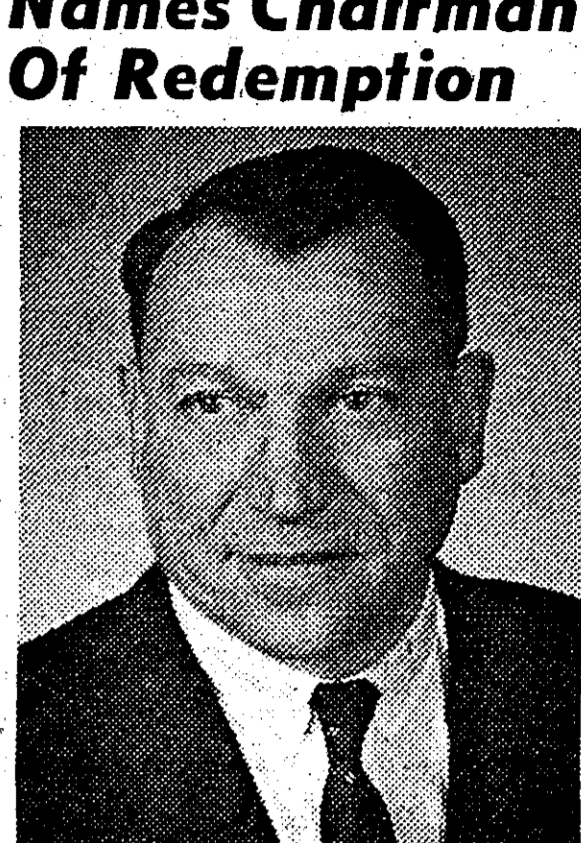

The Bar-Ilan University in Ramat Gan, Israel, is patterned academically after American and Canadian universities. It was established 11 years ago to provide a university specializing in the humanities and sciences that is rooted in the moral, ethical and religious teachings of Judaism. Students from this continent are enabled to receive part of their education there with full credits from home universities.

Fully accredited and recognized by the Government of Israel, it offers wide instruction in Judaica, natural sciences, mathematics, social sciences, language and literature.

Earlier this year the university received a provisional charter from the board of regents of the State of New York conferring upon it the right to award bachelors' and mas-

ters' degrees in the arts and sciences, and the Ph.D. degree in Judaic studies.

The enrolment of the student body for 1966 has reached over 2,500.

"American Judaism: Wasteland or Renaissance," will be the topic of the lecture by historian Max Dimont on Monday evening, Oct. 17, at the Shaarey Zedek Synagogue.
