Miss Folklorama '75 Hadassah Launches Goldsweep Project

Barb Daien, representing the Israeli pavilion, was chosen Miss Folklorama '75 on Sunday, Aug. 17, 1975, in the Centennial Concert Hall. She will participate in activities throughout the coming year and reign over the Folklorama festival in 1976. Barb is the daughter of Cantor and Mrs. Jerry Daien. She is a graduate of the Joseph Wolinsky Collegiate (Talmud Torah) and is now studying Social Work at the University of Manitoba. The criteria for selection of Miss Folklorama focused on the candidate's knowledge of her culture and heritage. Barb's fluency in Hebrew and Yiddish and participation in the Chai Folk Ensemble and other Jewish community activities weighed heavily in her favor. The unprecedented success of the Shalom Square Pavilion this year was certainly an asset to Barb's qualifications. The entertainers, Caberet Shalom, Special Blend and Rabbi Yossi Rosenzweig held the crowds enthralled each evening. Mayor David Cohen welcomed visitors, some of whom had waited hours before being able to enter the Pavilion.

The objective is to collect used, discarded metal objects for conversion into much-needed cash for Israel. Hadassah-WIZO women in every community — 16,000 across the country — will collect items of gold, plate or filled, sterling silver, silver plate, brass, and any pieces containing any amount of valuable metal, which is capable of being recycled. New Rabbi For Herzlia City Congregations to Set Pace In High Holiday Bond Appeal



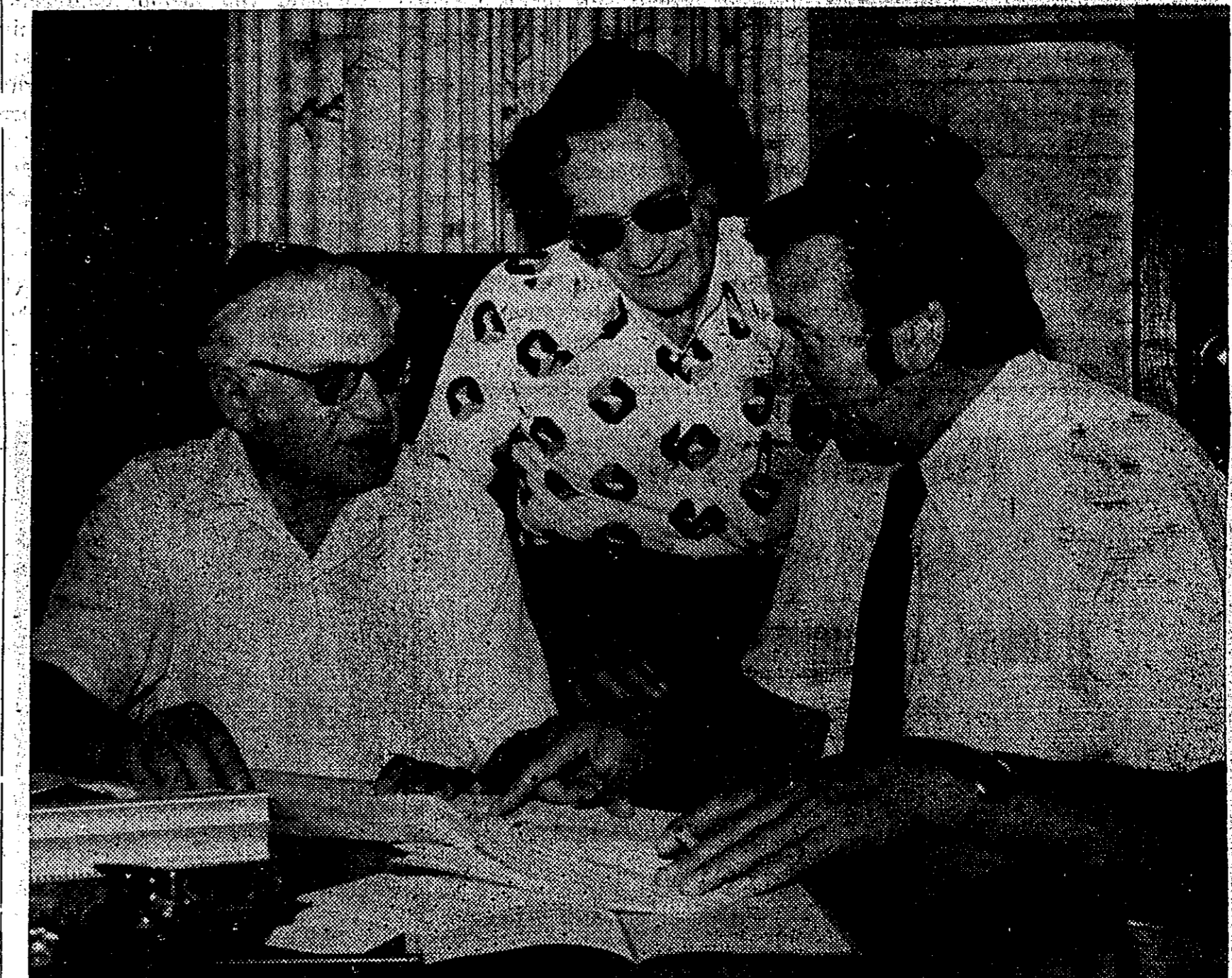
RABBI MICHAEL NEWMAN

Dr. Charles Malkin, president of Herzlia Adas Yeshurun Congregation and Herzlia Academy, announces the appointment of Rabbi Michael Newman, of London, Eng., as its spiritual leader and principal of its school effective Sept. 1, 1975.

Rabbi Newman was born and educated in England and holds a first class Honors B.A. degree (equivalent to Summa Cum Laude), and a Master of Philosophy degree from London University and a Rabbinical diploma from Jews' College, London, England. He received his Semicha from both Beer Yaakov and Mercaz Ha-Rav Yeshivot and from both the Ashkenazi Rabbi, the former Chief Rabbi of Israel, Rabbi Israel Unterman, as well as from the Sephardic Rabbi Nissim.

Since returning from Israel he has been Rabbi of the twin towns of Luton and Dunstable. He is the elder son of Rabbi Dr. Eugene Newman, a leading English rabbi and now ministering in Golders Green United Synagogue, the largest Orthodox Synagogue in England. He is married to the former Miss Sandra Stoller of Toronto.

Rabbi Newman's first official duties will entail conducting High Holiday services.
