

### W. Diamond Honored By Edmonton Jewry On 25th Anniv. of Synagogue

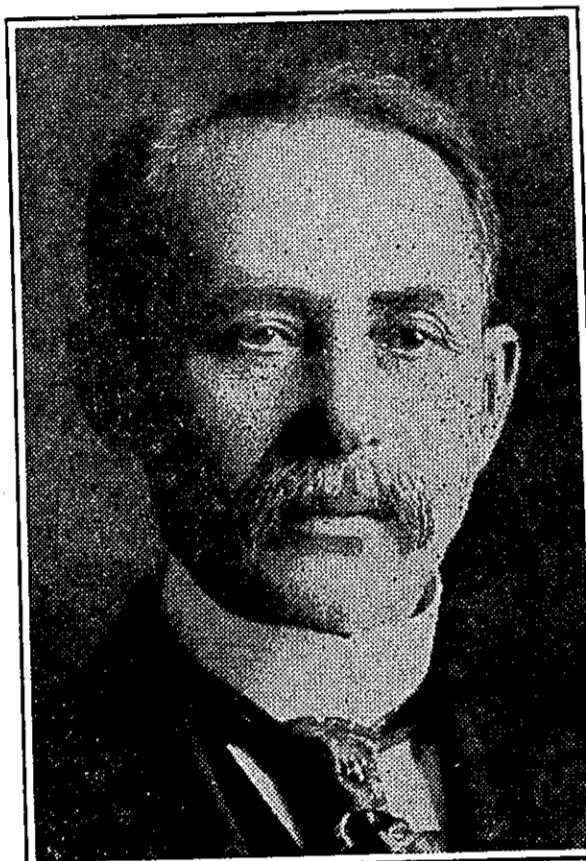
