Clark reports Lance-Cpl. Swartz as confirming an observation made by another soldier who told of meeting in the battle for Caen crowds of Germans who he swears were kids, not one of them over 17 and one or two of them he doubted if they were much past 14.

The correspondent then quotes Swartz as follows: "I think that air bombardment must have shocked a lot of them silly. Our platoon had come up a draw or gully about 400 yards long, full of mines and booby traps. We tripped one wire and one of those jumping S mines leaped five feet in the air and didn't go off. That shocked us silly for a minute, but we kept on, and suddenly off the sides of the gully and from straight ahead came a whole company of Germans, their hands in the air and shouting at us and waving their hands over their heads. These were the kids I speak of. Not a man among them was over 21."

Continuing, Clark writes: "With two of his section, later in the battle he came under very severe sniper fire, and his best chum was wounded in the stomach. It was just a skin wound cutting the wall of the stomach but not damaging the organs. Swartz bandaged him and then left him comfortable to work round the sniper. But the sniper had also worked round, and before Swartz's very eyes, but too far off for him to lend aid, the sniper fired 15 shots into the wounded chum lying on the ground and trying to crawl away."
