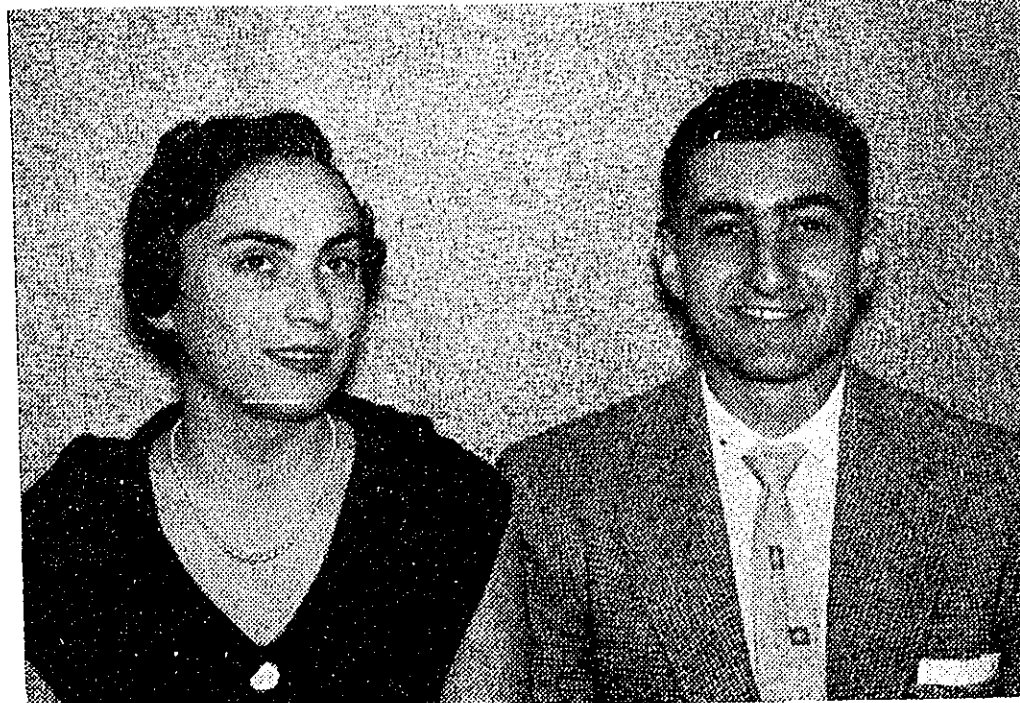

Canadian Families Take Up New Life In Israel

When the "Zion" left New York on Oct. 14, she counted among her passengers the first two Canadian families to depart for Israel under the auspices of the Middle Class Chalutzit Committee of the Zionist Organization of Canada.

Of particular local interest is the departure of Mr. and Mrs. A. H. Teich of Winnipeg, who intend to set themselves up in private farming. With Aliyah in mind, Mr. Teich followed his graduation in Arts at the University of Manitoba with a three-year course in the Faculty of Agriculture. The Teich's real interest in immigration became aroused with the appearance of a series of advertisements on opportunities in Israel in the Anglo-Jewish press and subsequent correspondence established the contact with the Middle Class Chalutzit Committee which has now culminated in Aliyah. Both these young people have a background in the Zionist youth movement and are fully prepared for the new life which awaits them. "We are going to Israel," said Mr. Teich, "because we believe it to be the proper place for us. Private farming is our choice and we are materialistic enough to expect a fair standard of living. We eagerly throw in our lot with the people of Israel and look forward to doing our share in the upbuilding of the Jewish State."

Toronto was represented by Samuel and Fredda Appleby and their seven children, ranging in age from 16 to six months, who will make their new home in Kiriyat Gat, hub of the newly developed Lachish area. Mr. Appleby is in the building trades.

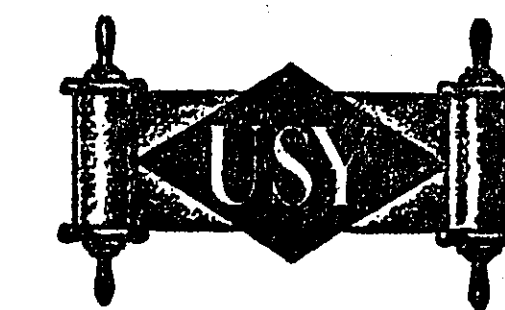
