**URGE SUPPORT FOR BALFOUR GOLDEN BOOK CAMPAIGN**

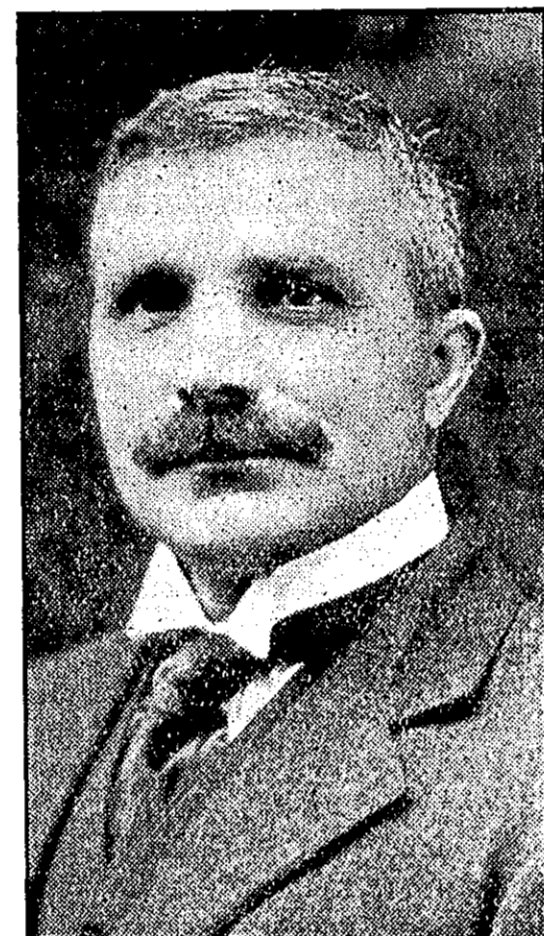

**THE PART THAT POWER HAS PLAYED IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF CANADA**

(Extract from an address given by Charles Price-Green, Commissioner, Department of Natural Resources, Canadian National Railways, Montreal, before the Advertising Club of Montreal, Wednesday, Feb. 5, 1930.)  
The progress of Canada during the last few years has no parallel, it has outstripped the wings of the most optimistic dreams. This is illustrated in a statement made two years ago by the "League of Nations" that "the rate of growth of wealth per capita of the population of Canada, during the last 20 years has never been achieved by any other Nations." During the period Canada's trade has multiplied eight times; she leads all others in favorable trade balance per

head of population and, with the exception of New Zealand, in exports, per capita, the average of the last twelve years being \$130—more than three times that of the United States. One of the main contributing causes to Canada's prosperity has been the development of hydro electricity on a very large scale. I have a vision of the future in which this power will make Canada one of the greatest industrial countries in the world. Already it has enabled us to rise to leadership in the manufacture of pulp and paper; contributed to the upbuilding of a great mining industry; and in general manufacturing. This country has now developed some five million seven hundred horsepower and with plants under construction this total will be brought to well over seven millions. Such figures mean little to the lay mind, but a concrete idea of what one hundred thousand horsepower means can be gleaned if one thinks of a million slaves working on the Great Wall of China, or building the Pyramids of Egypt. The history of this development is truly remarkable when it is remembered that up to the time when the Ontario Power Company's plant came into operation thirty years ago the total hydro electric development in this country was only about one hundred and seventy thousand horsepower.
