Speaker Urges Jews To Face Hardships With Fortitude

Jews were urged to retain their confidence in themselves and to be guided by the conviction that their destiny is in their own hands by Dr. C. S. Radwan, guest speaker at the B'nai B'rith luncheon club Tuesday noon at the Marlborough hotel. Samuel Freedman presided.

Dr. Radwan, a Polish scientist who was a student of Dr. Sigmund Freud and Dr. Alfred Adler, described the present tendency of people to lack self-confidence. "We are at odds with ourselves," he said. Victims of repression have no power to influence people, he added. What we need is psychic vitamins, Dr. Radwan said.

The speaker called upon the leaders of the United Nations to carry out a "war of nerves" against the enemy. Advancing mental training the doctor gave his audience a concrete illustration of his own highly developed psychic powers. D. Leipsic moved the vote of thanks.

Historic Link Of Jews And British Traced By M. J. Finkelstein

Destiny has decided that Great Britain should come to the aid of the Jewish people at this time when they are fighting a life and death struggle against extermination in every part of the world, M. J. Finkelstein, K.C., told members of the Chaim Weizmann club at a dinner meeting in the St. Regis hotel Thursday evening.

The speaker recalled that 1900 years ago the Jews living in Palestine and the Celts living in what is today the British Isles both fought subjugation by the Roman legions. The Roman generals of that day had to decide between the conquest of Britain of Judea, and as a result of their decision Judea was crushed in 130 A.D. and Britain lived.

"Since that time the Jews and the British people have been linked in times of danger," Mr. Finkelstein said. The issuing of the Balfour Declaration to the Jewish people by England was evidence of the mysterious working of history which has linked the Jews and the British, the speaker said. "The Balfour Declaration and the mandate given to the Jewish people by England with all its faults was a wonderful thing," Mr. Finkelstein declared.

Urging his listeners to greater forbearance Mr. Finkelstein pointed out that time as the measure of history is larger than that of the individual. By the measure of history the speaker expressed confidence that the objective of the Jewish people would be realized. "What we want in Palestine is a Jewish Commonwealth, a democracy with a Jewish majority connected with Great Britain and under the British flag," Mr. Finkelstein stated. A bi-national state as advocated by Dr. Judah L. Magnes would mean the liquidation of Zionism, the speaker declared. Dr. M. A. Bregman moved the vote of thanks.

Roy Calof, chairman of the 1942 U.P.A. campaign, reported that more than \$23,000 had been raised to date and that this sum had been contributed by more than 800 donors, a record amount given by an all-time high number of contributors. He expressed confidence that the quota would be reached. He thanked the club for its splendid support of the drive.

L. Gunn reported that \$6,000 had been contributed by members of the Chaim Weizmann club to the U.P.A. M. E. Kopstein presided.

N. Stern, Resident Here For 30 Years, Dies Monday

N. Stern, a resident of Winnipeg for 30 years, died Monday at the home of his daughter, Mrs. I. Gunn. The funeral was held from the home of his daughter, 384 Mountain avenue, to the Makarver synagogue. Burial took place in the Shanrey Zedek cemetery. Surviving him are two sons, L. and N. Stern; two daughters, Mrs. Shafer and Mrs. Gunn; one brother, Gabriel Stern, all of Winnipeg, and two sisters in Russia; 20 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. Mr. Stern followed strictly the tenets of the Orthodox belief.

Brandon Jewish Community Opens Refreshment Centre For Use Of Men And Women In Active Forces

Ghitteman with the assistance of several of the servicemen. Following the service a light lunch is served in the recreation room.
