The new board of directors of the Jewish Old Folks' Home is to be elected on Sunday, Nov. 23. There are ten men and five women to be voted in, and the ballot will be open at the Home, 146 Magnus avenue east, from 2 to 5 p.m.

Nominations are invited for those willing to serve on the board of one of the premier institutions in Western Canada, and one which carries out a sphere of work which has no counterpart throughout the West. All subscribers of not less than \$3 annually to the Home or every member of the Jewish community who contributes \$6 to the Winnipeg Community Chest is eligible to nominate, to be nominated, to vote or be voted for. Nominations must be received not later than Nov. 14. Prior to the elections the annual general meeting will be held, and a report is to be given of an exceptionally active year, when more comforts than even have been provided for the residents at the Home, with enlarged facilities and scope. The residents themselves are constantly expressing their overwhelming gratitude for the continual improvements.

"The enthusiasm among the more than 100 residents fills us with the desire to continually ease their lot in their declining years," says B. (Tubby) Fingard, social and publicity chairman. "To see smiles and happiness in their faces is our reward. We are anxious to do still more to make them more comfortable and to feel really at home," he added in a press statement.

Among new gifts to the Home is a new hospital folding wheelchair, presented by Mr. and Mrs. David Freed, only one of many similar acts by these great benefactors of the institution, who are devoted to its work.
