fiercely independent projection," which "does not remain aloof from congregational life, as does its better-endowed competitor."
Rabbi Silverman notes with approval that "The Jewish Spectator" "threw cold water on the jubilation of the American Jewish Defence agencies" in the matter of their attitude to the Supreme Court decision on the constitutionality of the New York Regent's prayer, and that the "Jewish Spectator's" dissent from the "official line" of the defence organizations was the first and only challenge they had been confronted with "for the past thirty years."
