

**PEDESTRIAN CROSSWALK CAMPAIGN**

Spring often produces exuberance particularly for drivers of 4 and 2-wheel vehicles.

The Greater Winnipeg Safety Council is deeply concerned that driver exuberance too often means "Spring in the Air" for the pedestrian.

The Safety Council congratulates drivers for their "people path" manners.

"People Paths are a great success in Winnipeg," stated Hugh Bebbington, president of the Greater Winnipeg Safety Council.

Many motorists, however, seem to have forgotten that the pedestrian has the right to cross the street at any intersection.

Eighteen pedestrians were killed in Metro Winnipeg during 1967. Over 66 per cent died because the driver failed to yield to the pedestrian.

The Greater Winnipeg Safety Council strongly urges drivers to remember that EVERY intersection has one or more pedestrian crosswalks.

There is an important difference between a pedestrian crosswalk and a pedestrian corridor. The difference once is clearly explained in a pedestrian crossing leaflet. Write to the Greater Winnipeg Safety Council, 206 - 233 Portage Ave., or phone 947-0043.

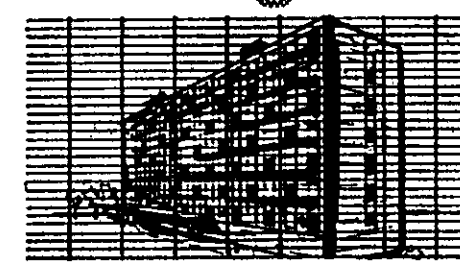
