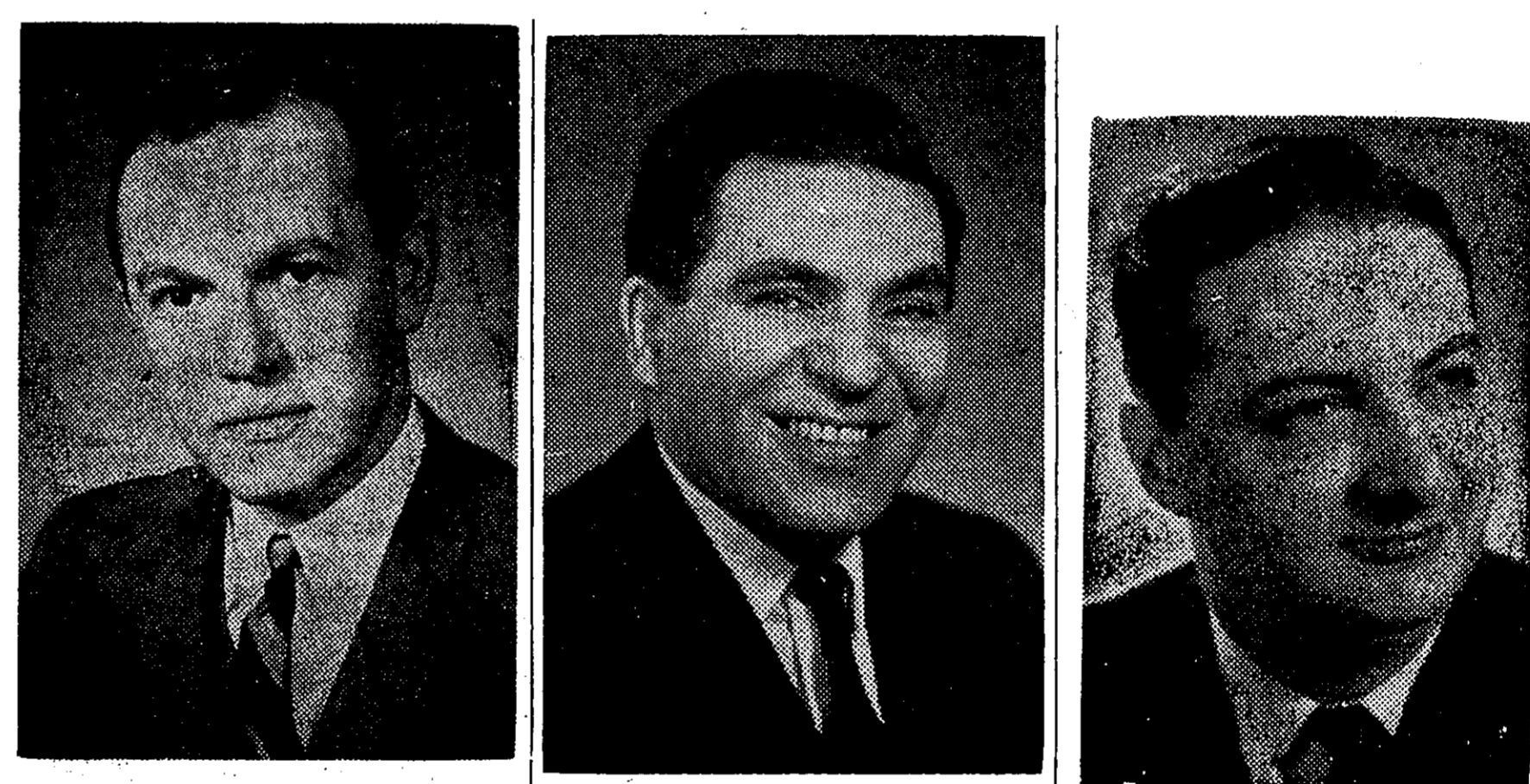

Weizmann - Sharon Zionist Club Adopt Kindergarten in Safed



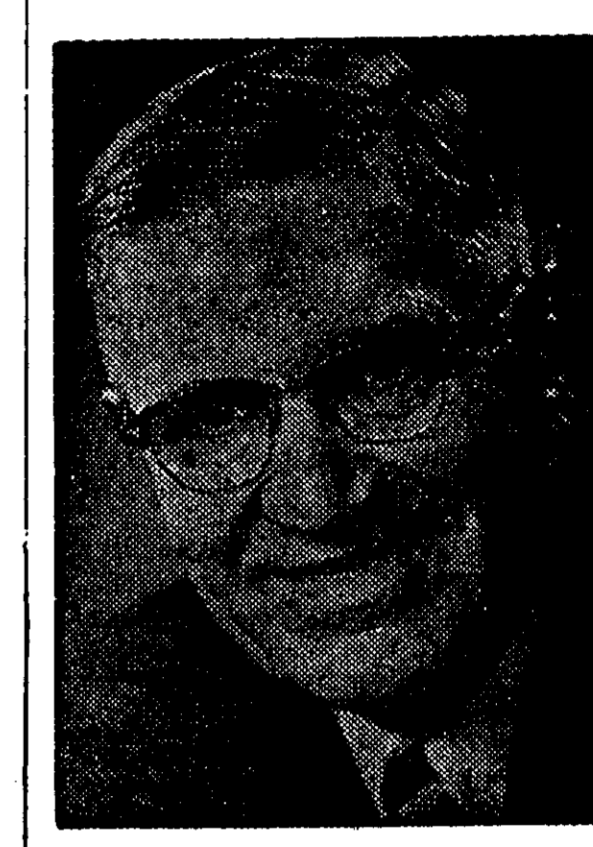

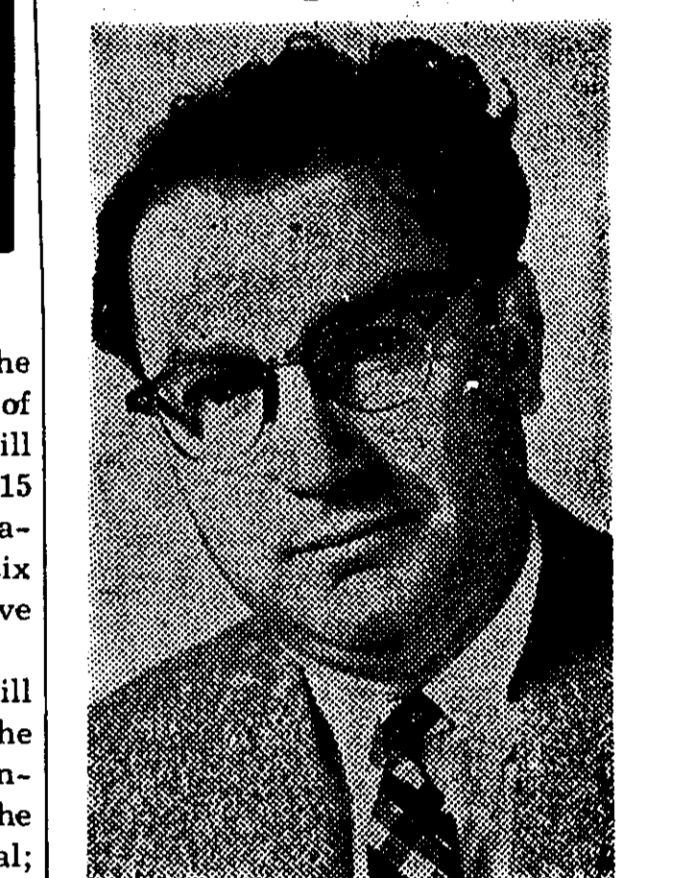
