### PEC Sales Here Reach \$125,000 In 4 Day Drive By Friedgut, Gelber

First mass "small man" private investment in Israel enterprise by Canadians, a \$50,000 cooperative subscription representing 500 shares was made here Tuesday night in Palestine Economic Corporation of Canada Limited on behalf of the members of the city's three men's Zionist clubs.

In all, Jewish Winnipeggers subscribed \$125,000 in PEC of Canada shares this week — also acclaimed as a record—during a special visit by Mr. Gelber and Major A. H. Friedgut, agent-general of Zionist organization of Canada in Israel.

The \$50,000 cooperative subscription, presented to Mr. Gelber by Hart Green Jr. at a public meeting in Marlborough hotel, "will for the first time provide representation for the little man in the direction of the company's affairs."

The growing role of Canadian private investment in Israel highlighted the address of Major Friedgut, main speaker of the meeting jointly sponsored by the Mid-West Region and the three clubs.

**Untimely Passing of Dr. Gerald Olin Mourned**

The untimely passing of Dr. Gerald Olin, 30, of 35 Scotia street, occurred Tuesday, Dec. 4, in a tragic highway accident at Morden, Man. The deceased had interrupted his studies at the outbreak of World War II to spend over five years overseas, serving with the Medical Corps in North Africa, Italy, Holland and France.

Funeral services were held Dec. 5 from the Chesed Shel Emes chapel, with Rabbi H. Herson officiating, assisted by Cantor Jack Silverberg. Honorary pallbearers were Prof. F. W. Broderick, Murray Brenner, Bernard Kushner, Jack Olin and M. David Bogdanov.
