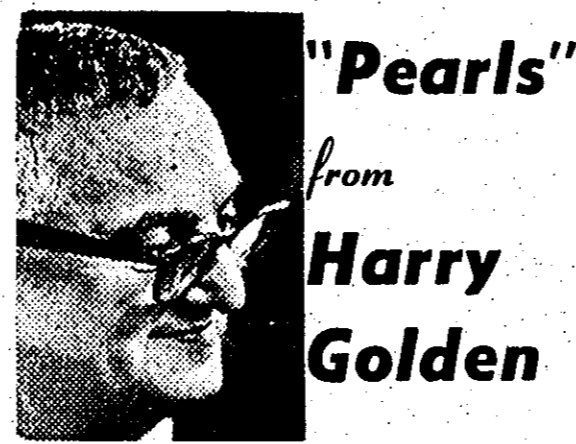

"Pearls" from Harry Golden

MARGARET SANGER AND EMANUEL To an East Side boy the name Margaret Sanger meant a good deal more than it does to the average native-born citizen. Mrs. Sanger did most of her early work on the Lower East Side of New York among

the Jewish immigrants and in Little Italy among the Italian immigrants. I remember her well. I felt I was her contemporary when I met her seven years ago, we seemed to be people of the same era. Yet, I also remember I was a boy, say about 15, at a meeting at the old Labor Temple on 14th Street and Second Avenue listening to Margaret Sanger, a grown-up "old lady." She spoke often at several settlement houses in the tenement districts of the city. The amazing thing about Margaret Sanger is that birth control started out as a one-woman crusade. Today it blankets the entire world. I remember her telling the

immigrant women over and over again that they wouldn't live long if they had a baby every year. She explained she did not want to take away babies from them nor to take away the joy of raising children. It would be better for their children she said if new brothers and sisters arrived every three years instead of every year. And then she offered them her pamphlets printed in English, Yiddish, Polish, and Italian. And yet the name Margaret Sanger also demands some justice come to a man rarely mentioned now, Emanuel Haldeman-Julius, publisher of The Little Blue Books

emanating from his Appeal to Reason Publishing house in Girard, Kansas. I did some writing for Emanuel Haldeman-Julius, human interest stuff, experiences as a hotel clerk, later insights into the coming social struggle in the South. He had his faults as we all do. I was amused and sometimes dismayed at his waste of talent when he postured and prided himself as the chief of all the atheists. He tried so desperately to chase God out of heaven, and never once realized he was far more obnoxious in his "evangelizing" than the most zealous tent evangelist of whom he made such fun.

Incidentally I wrote a similar article when Clarence Darrow died. Incredible as it seems, there was a time when Darrow too couldn't get anything published except at Girard, Kansas. E. Haldeman-Julius put his colophon on the first material Clarence Darrow ever put out under his name. It is eminently worthwhile to know that Margaret Sanger, Clarence Darrow, and E. Haldeman-Julius, lived in my era, and how fortunate I am that I could call each of them - friend.

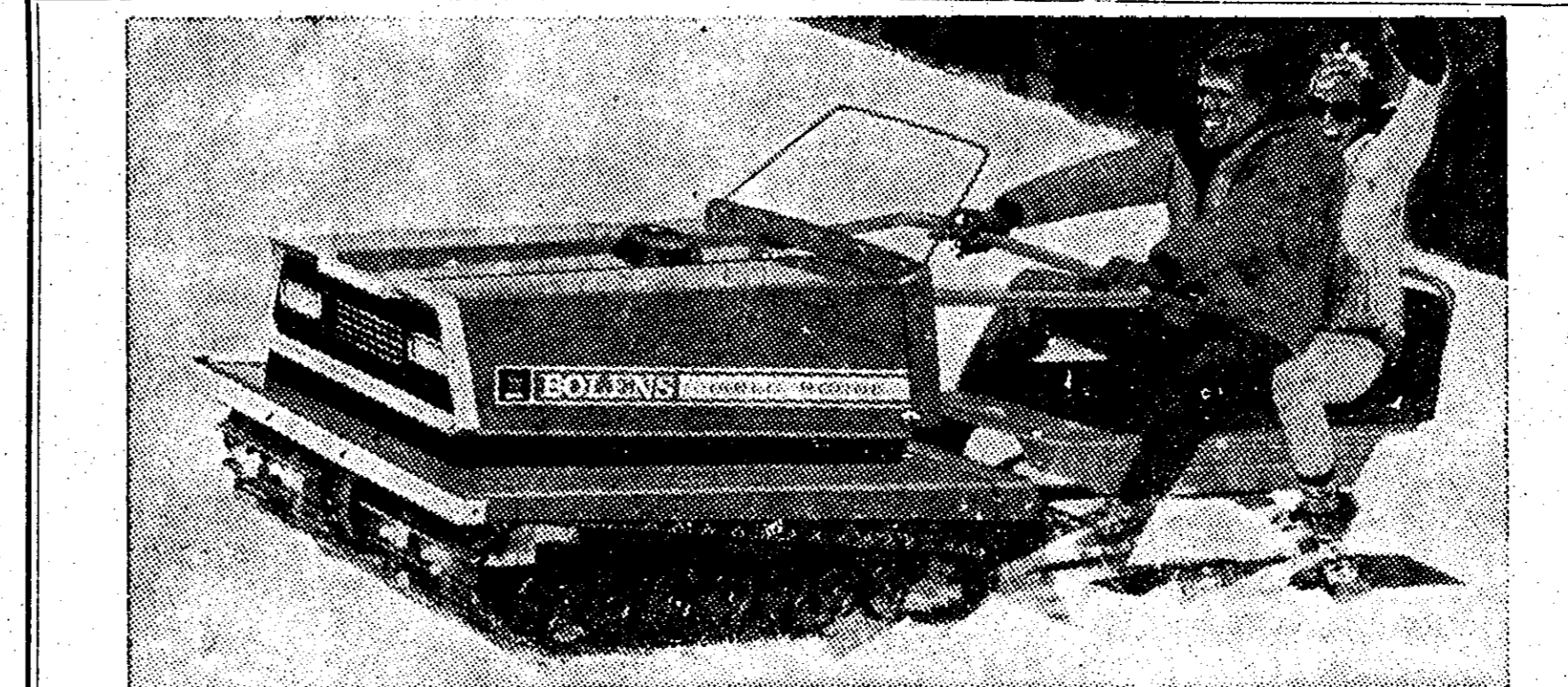
