The Golden Age Club July Birthday on Wednesday, July 2, will present a new and different entertainment. Please join us.

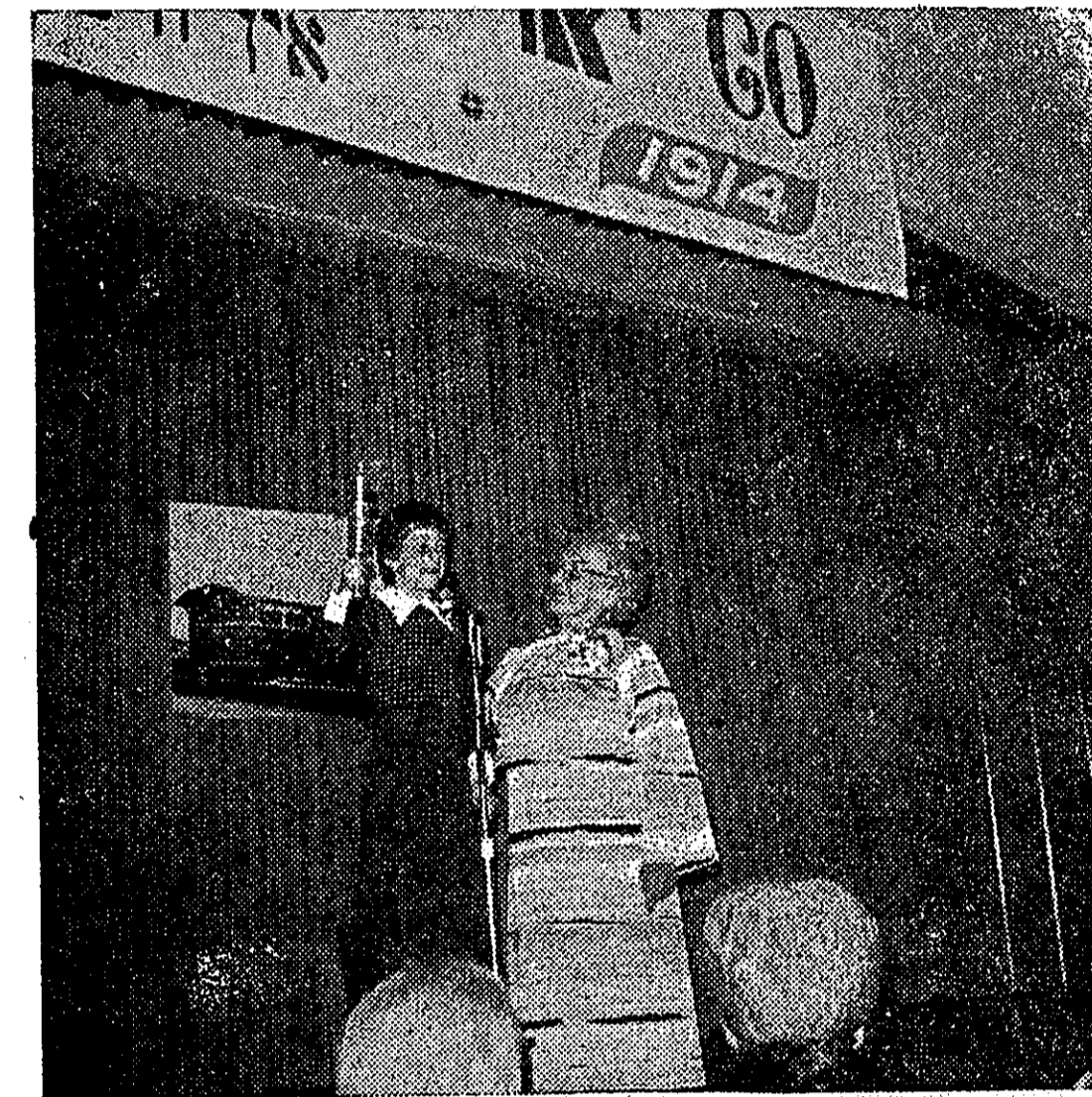
Moving the Sifrei Torah

Peretz Jubilee Windup



A HIGHLIGHT of the I. L. Peretz-Folk School 60th Anniversary Windup evening June 18 in Rosh Pina Synagogue was a warm tribute paid by the entire school family to Muter Ferein Branch 1. Established in 1919, the Branch set the pattern for parent participation in support of the school and in perpetuation of the institution's ideals. Aliza Abrams, Grade 3 student, is shown presenting a silver Megillah to Mrs. Louis Sedletsky, one of the original members of the Branch, who accepted it on behalf of the Muter Ferein.

The I. L. Peretz-Folk School wound up a year-long series of events celebrating the 60th anniversary of the institution's founding with a determination to continue at the forefront of those engaged in perpetuating Jewish education, culture and traditions. Well over 700 persons gathered June 18 in Rosh Pina Synagogue auditorium for a heartwarming Jubilee Windup evening which combined graduation ceremonies with a special tribute to the school's staunchest supporters — the dedicated ladies of Muter Ferein. While proud of its past, the school continues to innovate, moving ahead with the times. Veteran supporters work side by side with energetic parents and with the school's alumni whose leadership talents have been recognized by the Jewish community of Winnipeg, of Canada and elsewhere.

Speakers reminded the large audience that the Peretz School established the first Jewish Day School and the first Jewish kindergarten on the continent. Telegrams of congratulation included one from former Israeli Prime Minister Golda Meir. Read by Mittl Shul graduate, Lawrence Stoller, Mrs. Meir's telegram referred to the school's achievements as unprecedented in the Diaspora and urged a continuation of the school's dedicated efforts.

Following greetings by Mrs. David Minuk, Muter Ferein Council president, Grade 3 student Aliza Abrams presented a silver Megillah to Branch 1, accepted by Mrs. Louis Sedletsky, one of the original members. Also present from the original members were Mesdames H. Pearlman, I. Polinsky and A. Rosenberg. Jubilee committee chairman Mrs. Laurie Fineman, who presided, referred to the Muter Ferein movement as "the heart and soul" of the school. When Branch 1 was inaugurated in 1919, the women went from door to door to obtain students for the school, and they returned to the homes at regular intervals to collect the modest tuition fees to help pay school expenses.

Past school president D. I. Victor introduced Branch 1 members in attendance, all of whom were designated honorees of the evening. Following the presentations by the school choir, directed and accompanied by Mrs. Ben Katz, greetings were delivered by Oscar Antel, national vice-president, Canadian Jewish Congress, Western Region; W. Z. Chudnow, school president, and Morley M. Globerman, president, Winnipeg Community Council. Provincial Judge Robert Kopstein, chairman of the school's board of education, presided over the 51st elementary school and the Mittl Shul graduation ceremonies. Former graduates who participated in presentation of awards and diplomas included Mrs. B. Shibus, Mrs. J. Poznansky, Mrs. Phil Katz, Saul Cherniack and Monte Nathanson. Graduating students were presented by Principal Shimon Hellek, elementary school valedictorians were Beverly Werbuk and Marlene Hasklin, while Fay-Lynn Gutvilk made the response for the Mittl Shul. The eight Mittl Shul graduates were presented with scholarships to Israel where they will spend seven weeks. The evening came to a close with a toast to the school delivered by Mrs. Abe Stoller, co-chairman of the Jubilee committee.

Jewish Child and Family Service Annual Meeting, Thursday June 12

The Jewish Child and Family Service faces a \$140,000 deficit by March 1976, said Phillip Schachter, president of the Agency.

Mr. Schachter was speaking to over 200 people attending the annual meeting of the Jewish Child and Family Service, Thursday, June 12, in the Holiday Inn. He blamed the United Way and the Manitoba Government for the Agency's financial difficulty. He said the United Way had changed from being a deficit funding agency about two years ago, and now provided a grant which was less than the deficit. The Provincial Government under its present policy would not cover administrative

costs in the Children's Department, and this was where most of the shortfall occurred. "In plain English," said Mr. Schachter, "The United Way has cut us adrift, telling us to look to Government, and the Government has, up to now, told us they cannot and will not help us while we remain Jewish. We need help, and we will remain Jewish."

Mr. Schachter said the Agency had been promised a meeting with the Minister of Health and Social Development, Laurent Desjardins, at which representatives of the Winnipeg Jewish Community Council would also be present. This meeting is to take place shortly after the session of the House is finished. Mr. Schachter said he was pleased with the relationship developing between the Winnipeg Jewish Community Council and the Agency. "I have found that there is no adversary situation. We are trying our best to work together."

Ed Moscovitch, executive director of the service, said he feels there's a definite need for government to finance basic services, co-ordinate those services and set standards for them, but he doesn't think government can meet children's day-to-day needs. Phil Sheps presented the treasurer's report and the camp corporation report, and Dr. Harry Prosen presented the report of the nominating committee. Harvey Selter presented Certificates of Appreciation for their work on behalf of the Agency to Jim Smalley, Mrs. Judy Linhart and Dr. Harry Prosen.

Mrs. Linhart acted as moderator of a panel discussion called "From Russia to Winnipeg", in which recent Jewish immigrants from Russia discussed their experiences and feelings. Mrs. Irene Walsh told of her involvement with the Russian immigrants and their adjustments to their new life in Winnipeg.
