The government's concern over the Fascist situation was given increased emphasis when a Blackshirt meeting in Hampstead, in the West End where few Jews live, broke up in a bloody riot. The trouble started when one of the speakers attacked the Jews. A number of people in the audience protested audibly and as they were being removed from the hall were hit by flying missiles. This was the signal for a free-for-all in which men and women battled for nearly an hour.

**Attorney-General Reiterates Warning  
To Propagators Of Race Hatred; Urges  
Citizens Not To Take Law Into Own Hands**

In reply to the request of a representative of The Jewish Post for a statement on the present attitude of the government towards fomentors of race hatred and agitators in the province, Hon. W. J. Major, K.C., attorney-general, reaffirmed his courageous utterances made on behalf of the government in February, 1934, in the House and added a sharp warning to those who were attempting to take law and order into their own hands in coping with the situation.

The question was placed before Mr. Major a few days ago, following the reappearance of the Canadian Nationalist party which was driven under cover following the granting of an unjunction against its libellous sheet by Mr. Justice MacDonald in the Court of King's Bench.

The brief but pointed addition made by Mr. Major reads as follows:

Fred L. Fingerote, Esq.,  
The Jewish Post,  
Winnipeg, Man.

Dear Sir:

".....If I were asked to add a supplement to the statement I made in the Legislature some time ago it would be to the effect that any person who has reason to complain of the invasion of his rights and liberties would be most foolish to take the law into his own hands. Not only does our constitution assure a man of his liberty but it also provides the means for protecting him. Any individual or organization that encourages efforts being made to enforce the law through unlawful acts will only suffer as a consequence of those unlawful acts."

In The Jewish Post of July 16, 1936, excerpts from Mr. Major's address in the House were given. They are here repeated with comment by The Post:

"A memorable address, comparable to the finest pronouncements in the history of democracy, found their way into the records of the Manitoba Legislature in February 1934, when the Hon.

ed agitators to give the province a wide berth." On that occasion he said: "There is neither justification nor room anywhere in Canada for the old discords or hates of the old lands of Europe. Whoever is here, of whatever racial origin, British or other stock, must accept obligations of that citizenship and the first of these obligations is respect for and acceptance of our laws, and the rights of other citizens as defined by these laws. Whoever foments discord and hate between any sections of His Majesty's subjects is not only unworthy of citizenship, but is a law-breaker as well. Such persons are guilty of seditious conspiracy."

**Jewish Legion  
Organizes March  
On Palestine**

Warsaw, (WNS)—Ignoring an official government ban on its recruiting, the newly-organized Jewish legion which proposes to march to Palestine without visas or passports and demand admittance from the Palestine authorities, is rapidly becoming a fad among the younger Jews of Poland. Thousands of Jews between the ages of 19-32 are rushing to join the legion which is being recruited by M. Ruppel, who denies that he is a Revisionist and says he is a General Zionist. Ruppel, explains that all recruits must take a pledge to eat only kosher food and not to march on Saturdays. Married men must obtain their wives' consent before being enrolled. The first group of 1,000 legionnaires, wearing special uniforms and stocked with provisions for five days, will leave for Palestine within ten days. Ruppel says that the legionnaires will depend for additional food on the Jews of the countries through which they will pass, and in each country will ask the authorities for permission to cross frontiers without passports. Jewish public opinion here was at first hostile to this legion, but sentiment has now veered around.
