A program of Skills Workshops is being featured for Sept. 30. This program will centre on the contributions of different nations to world culture. 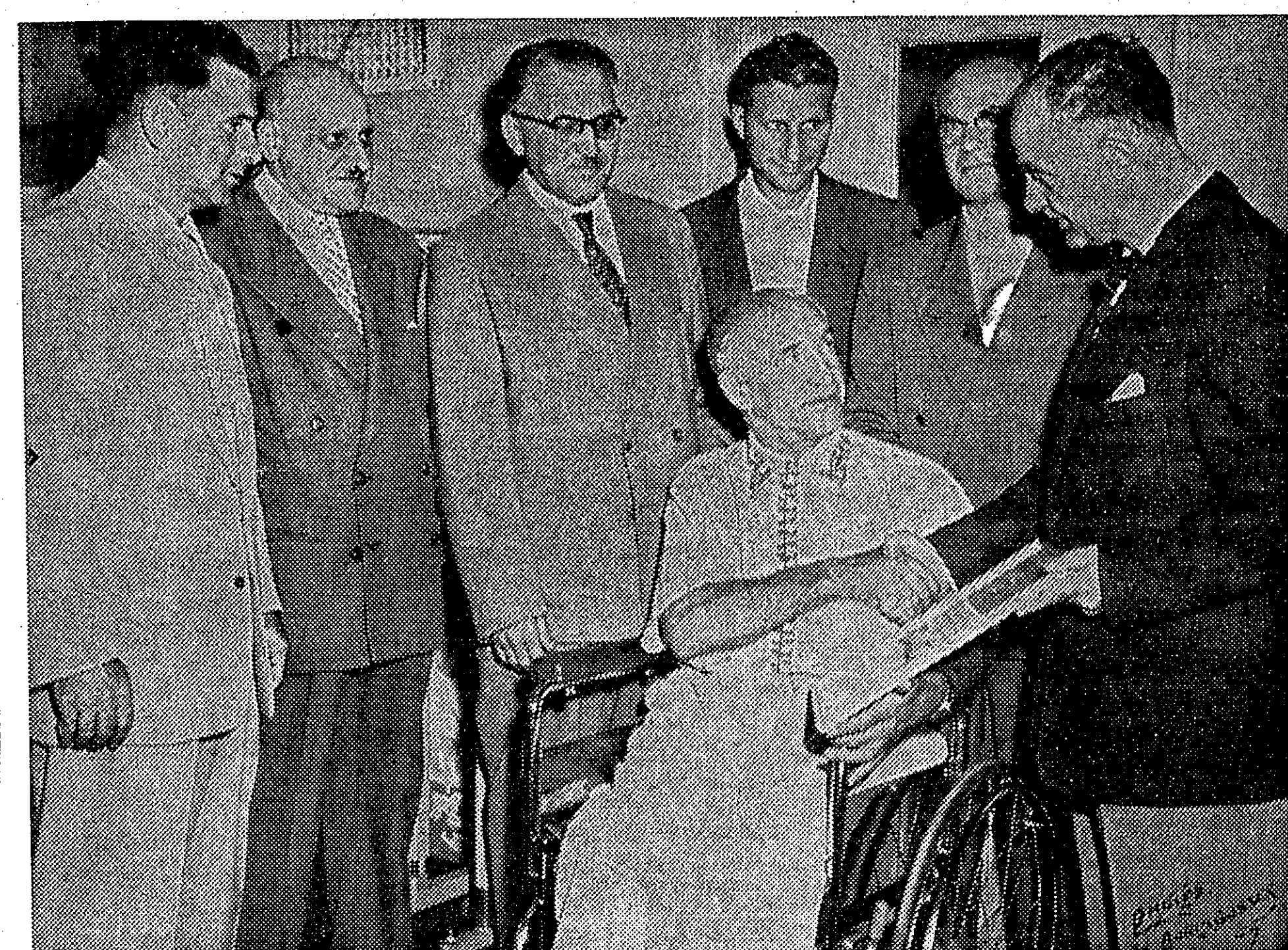
The Nanuet Hebrew Centre embraces approximately 160 families.
