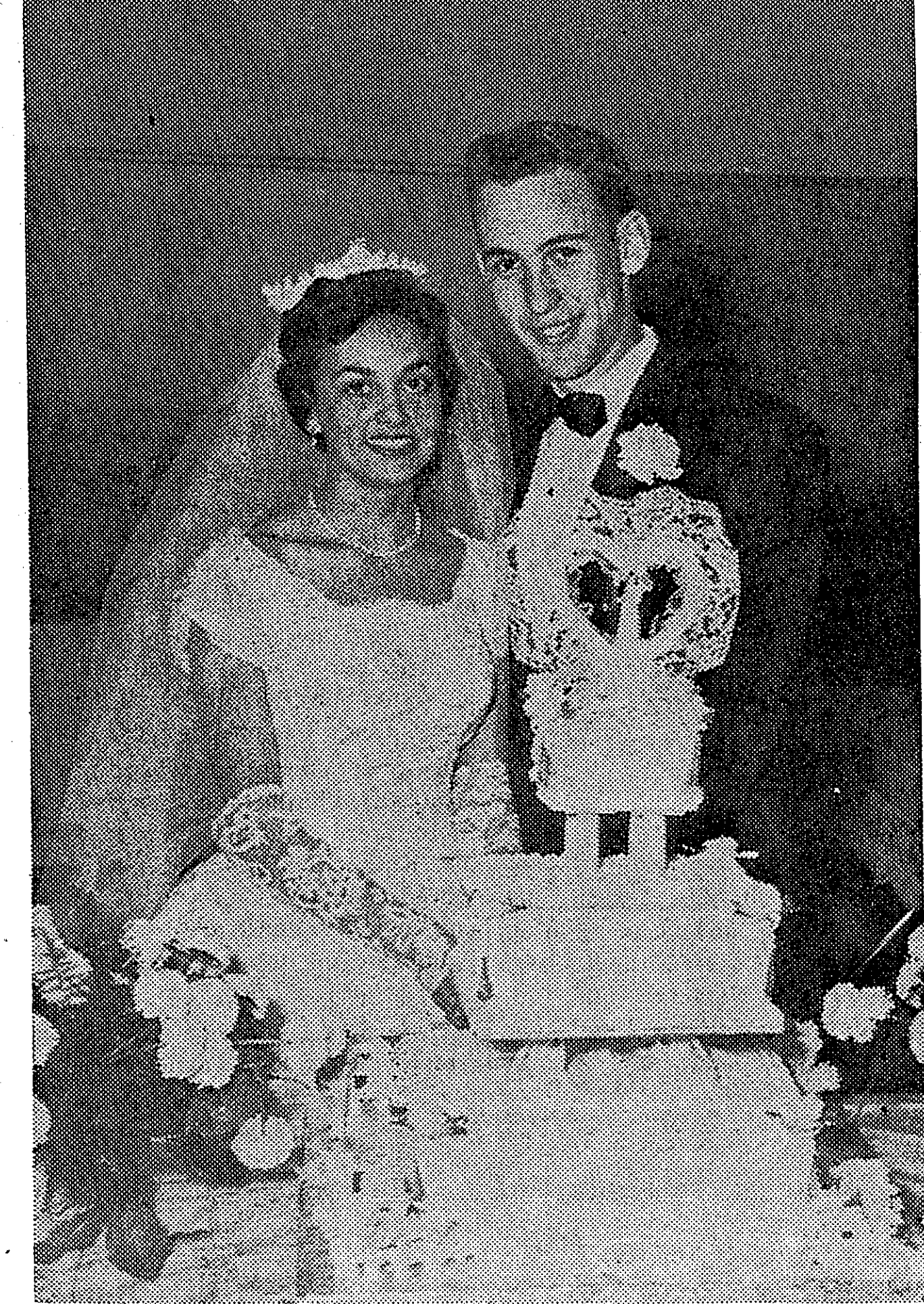

Jews Flee Hungary

VIENNA (JTA) — More than 1,300 Hungarian Jewish refugees already have been registered at Jewish communal and welfare agencies here with more pouring in daily, according to Charles H. Jordan, director-general of JDC. This continuing emergency has forced the JDC to alter its planning in preference to a long term program of direct relief and assistance to them. Continuing, Jordan reported new refugees are being registered with Jewish agencies at the rate of 150 a day. When the situation first arose, Jordan stated, "we thought it would only last a short time, but instead the problem has grown."

The small Austrian Jewish community is equipped to keep up with the expanding situation. Jordan revealed that he was returning to JDC's headquarters in Paris and thence to
