If friends so desire, contributions may be made to Hadassah.

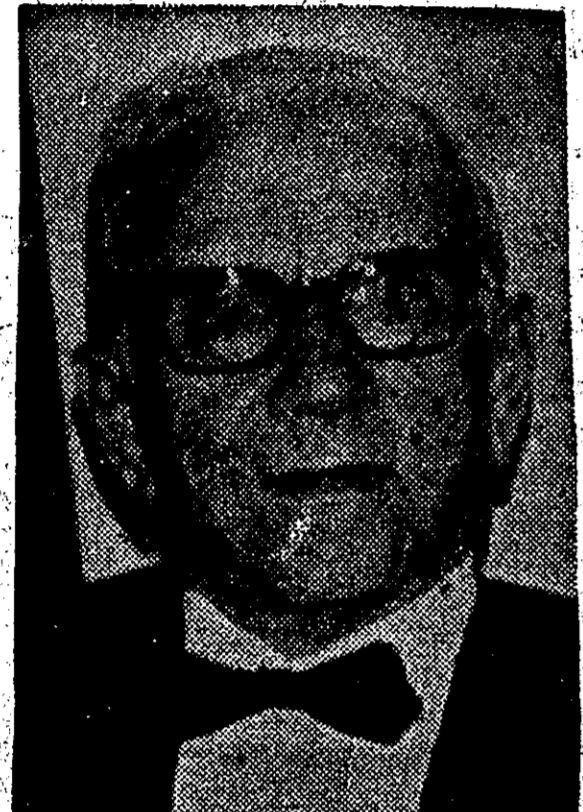

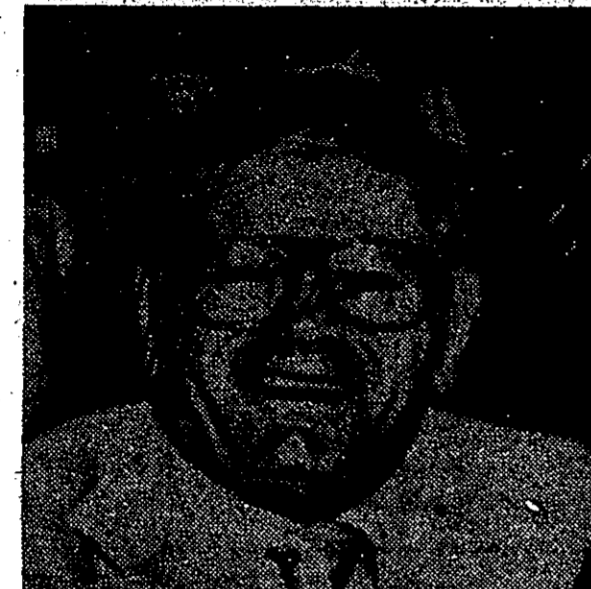
Six years have passed dear mother, since you left us to join Dad,

### Fascist Mosley Dead at 84

Paris — Sir Oswald Mosley, who founded the British Union of Fascists in 1932 and was detained for a period as a security risk during the Second World War, died at his home near Paris last Wednesday, aged 84 years.  
Imprisoned during World War II as a security risk, Mosley forfeited a potentially brilliant

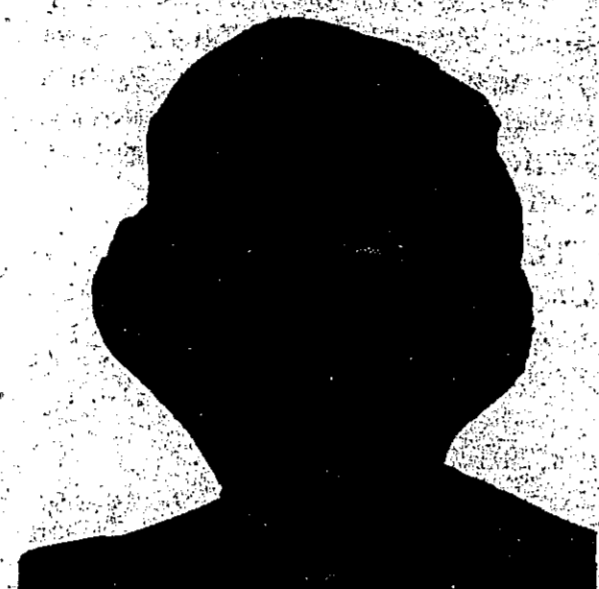
political career to found the blackshirts, which paraded in the streets and fought with opponents, while Mosley declaimed from a microphone.

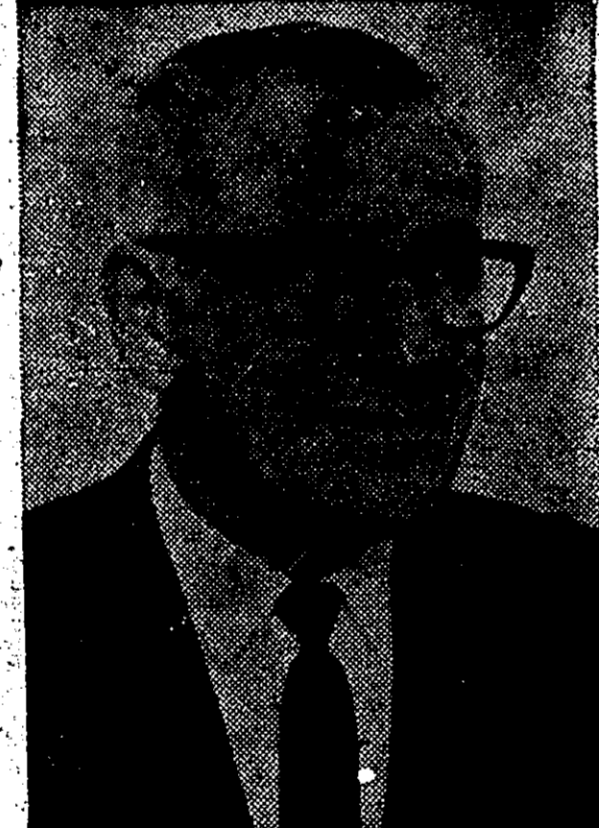

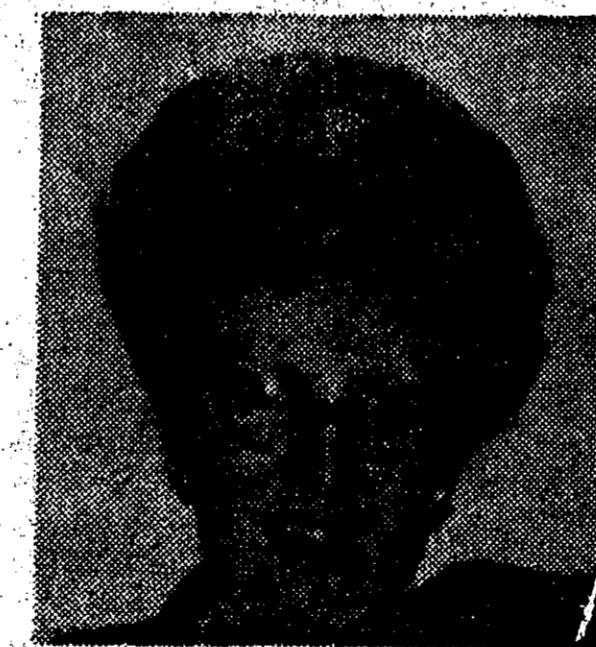

### Court Rejects Mayors' Appeal, Asks Government to Reconsider Decision

Jerusalem (JCNS) — Although it rejected an appeal by two Palestinian mayors against their expulsion from the occupied West Bank, Israel's Supreme Court has asked the government to reconsider its decision to deport them.  
The three-judge panel decided the orders expelling mayors Fahd Kawasme of Hebron and Mohammed Milhem of Halhoul were in accordance with laws governing the occupied territories and the State of Israel.

But the mayors' lawyer, Mrs. Felicia Langer, said the court also recommended that "it was now time for the political level to review the deportation order again."

The two mayors were deported the day after six Israelis were killed in Hebron by Arab terrorists. The authorities alleged they had incited the population against Israel and helped to create the conditions for the attack.

The mayors were held in a detention centre in Israel while the court heard their case.

### Israelis Testifying

Bonn (JCNS) — A group of six Israeli observers are in Kiel, West Germany, to attend the trial of a former Gestapo officer who had been responsible for the deportation of Belgian Jews during World War II.

Kurt Asche between 1942 and 1944 sent over 25,000 Belgian Jews to Auschwitz, where nearly all were gassed on arrival, only 1200 surviving.

The Israelis are all Holocaust survivors or children of survivors. They will join Belgian Jews who will take turns in being present in the small courtroom where the trial is being held.

A third Arab leader, the Muslim judge of Hebron, Sheik Rajab Taminin, was expelled with the two mayors but was not allowed to return to appeal against the decision. The Supreme Court found a prima facie case of incitement against him.

The court recommended that the government should allow the mayors to "prove the integrity of their declarations without being deported."

In their appeal, the mayors pledged to abide by military government regulations and denounced bloodshed.
