executed. Mrs. Jannette Guttman and Mrs. Mireille Kantor were responsible for the choreography and the directing of the dances. Mrs. Guttman was also the piano accompanist.
The choir, under the direction of Cantor B. Brownstone, with Mrs. Ann Feldman at the piano, set the tone of the concert with an opening group of Chanukah songs, and contributed a group of songs in the victory scene.
Bright backdrops and sparkling costumes blended wonderfully with the action and added a great deal of charm to the presentation.
Throughout the play there was no trace of theatrical rhetoric, of pompous exaggeration or over-emphasis. It was obvious to the viewer that the performers were under no strain, and that the Hebrew children were using what was natural to them and dear to their hearts.
In addition to the play there was also a tableau featuring such winsome characters as Storytellers, Candles, Spintops, Chanukah Gelt, and Latkes. This performance too was marked by the whole-heartedness with which the six-and-seven-year-olds had entered into the spirit of the play. They spun and skipped about with complete ease and abandon.
An interesting playlet concerning the imaginary trials and tribulations of a little girl and her doll was presented by another group of younger children. The participants - including winged angels and a doctor - were all delightful, displaying considerable histrionic ability.
This time, as on previous occasions, the Hebrew Theatre has fulfilled its two-fold purpose of delighting the hearts of a warmly-appreciative audience, and of affording a wholesome means of self-expression to its members. Once more it has proven itself to be a vital cultural and educational factor in the life of the community.

Once again has our Jewish community been treated to a heart-warming performance by the Hebrew Theatre of the Playhouse, on the night of the lighting of the first Chanukah candle, the Hebrew Theatre has succeeded admirably in recreating, before the eyes of a capacity audience, the glorious story of Chanukah.
The tragic mood of the tale of martyrdom of Chana and her seven sons, who died "Al Kidush Hashem," enacted against the dazzling background of the glittering court of the Greek tyrant Antiochus was captured poignantly in the opening scene of the play.
Many deft details were made use of to heighten the illusion of the backdrop of the second scene. The presence of the characteristic well, the plaintive cries of the vendors of pottery, linen, wine, and oil, the song of a flower girl calling out her wares in a truly Oriental fashion - all contributed to the authenticity of the Market Place at Modin.
The heroic spirit of the proud Maccabee was splendidly unfolded in the second scene dominated by the stern figure of Mattityahu - a tower of moral strength - calling his people to an armed rebellion against the Greeks.
The final scene was flooded with the atmosphere of triumph over the hated oppressor. The enthusiastic singing of "Hadikku Neiro!" in front of a brilliantly-lit Menorah formed a fitting and highly effective climax to the play.
The play was generously interspersed with dances introduced to heighten the effect of a dramatic moment. In all cases they were used to the best advantage, were imaginatively conceived, and gracefully

performed. The Talmud Torah is to be congratulated on possessing a Parent-Teachers' association which is solidly behind the Hebrew Theatre. The success of the play was due in great measure to their efforts.
The plays were produced and directed by Mr. and Mrs. Ephraim Malamuth. Mr. and Mrs. Dave Thompson were in charge of props and make-up.
