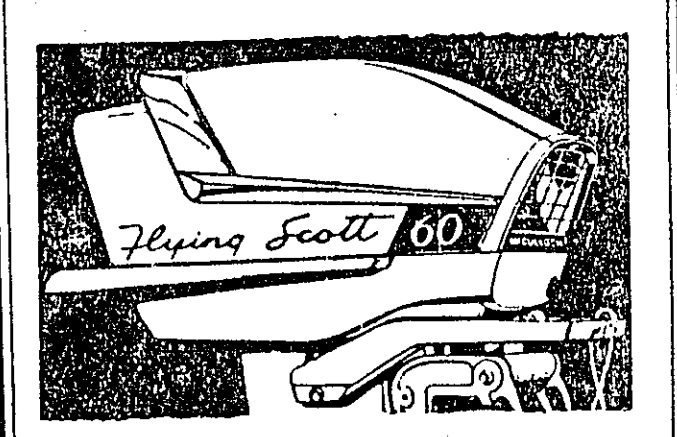
Mental Health Group News

To Review Work At Annual Meet

The Jewish Child and Family Service of Winnipeg will hold its annual meeting Thursday, May 12, at 8:30 p.m. at the YMHA. Agency activities for the past year will be reviewed and elections to the board of directors will be held. A feature of the program will be the presentation of the film, "The Deep Well" which was produced by the Jewish Child Care Association of New York and the Child Welfare League of America. Having won critical approval wherever it has been shown for its superb portrayal of some important current agency practices in dealing with children who need foster care, it deals with four particular problems with which child and family service agencies must deal:
—an agency's role in helping a family broken by a father's illness come together after it seemed destined to fall apart;
—how sound casework counseling gives new strength and insight to a distraught mother so that she can once again cope with her family situation;
—a wide range of casework, psychological and psychiatric services for an aggressive 11-year-old boy in a cottage-type institution;
—how sensitive casework in a carefully selected and supervised boarding home helps his eight-year-old sister.
Miss Helen Mann, director of the School of Social Work at the University of Manitoba, will discuss the film.
