WHAT DOES B'NAI B'RITH MEAN?

(An Editorial — By Richard E. Gutstadt)

The ordinary conception of B'nai B'rith purpose involves the appraisal of its more or less visible activities.

Hillel trained Jewish leadership has definitely perceptible value. The establishment in the white light of truth of Jewish thought and of Jewish aspiration; the eradication of false and inaccurate concepts; the repudiation of malevolent and damaging misrepresentation, all of which are embraced in the anti-Defamation League program, are easily recognized as beneficial to Jewish life. The manifestations of preparedness and efficiency which frequently revealed the B'nai B'rith as a piece of well organized Jewish machinery with a definite influence upon the mass life of World Jewry, are indisputably cogent in their appeal, but their relationship seem nebulous and somewhat difficult to comprehend.

Modern psychology advises, appropo of child training, "Determine what type of child you want to raise and be that kind of a parent." B'nai B'rith counsels that we should consider the Jewish type which we desire to evolve and be that kind of Jews ourselves.

The individual impress of the Jew upon community life and community development is minimized, unless the influence be exerted through group association. Attitudes adopted by the group inevitably permeates the life of most of the individuals who compose the group. Exalted leadership raises the level of the group with which the leadership is in contact.

Judaism has very definitely not completely discharged its social or ethical responsibility. So long as nations war against nations; while "man's inhumanity to man makes countless millions mourn;" while the least of our own people is ignorant of the aspiration and the contemplation of the sages and the prophets and the rabbis; just so long as humanity requires that there shall be protestants against social injustice, political inequality, religious bigotry and intellectual serfdom; just so long must the Jewish group realize its responsibility to continue its age-old struggle against these forces which prevent the finest expression of civilized thought and civilized conduct.

The factors which militate against the readiest realization of this lofty Jewish ideal are many. They raise within Jewish life and they press from without the circle of Jewish brotherhood. Effort from within can be made only through the agency of organization which reconciles differences. Freedom of thought and of expression must come to all groups on a common platform so that the finest of thought of every element may be welded to form the highest expression as a group contribution.

In order that the group thought may develop constructively, it must be permitted to do so with the least possible obstacles or impediment from without. Hitlerism and Cuzanism may impel Jews to herd together, but it does not conduce to the finest and most natural of Jewish expression. Such a coming-together is merely a revelation of the "self defense mechanism." B'nai B'rith urges Jews to forget their differences, not negatively, in self-defense, but affirmatively, for group development. B'nai B'rith demands the obliteration, of artificial demarcations, in order that all Jews may approach, unhindered by self-imposed barriers, to the sources of Jewish life and Jewish strength common to all. B'nai B'rith refuses to dignify Chauvinism to proportions which tend

by comparison to dwarf universalism. The Jewish world may not with safety be shrunken to the proportions of Silesia, Besarabia, Poland, or even Palestine. We have frequently permitted ourselves to blot out of our Jewish perspective, all of those vital and crucial problems which did not directly affect the one thing which, to us, seemed all-important. We must realize that only by an all-inclusive universalistic Jewish viewpoint can we intelligently cope with the problems affecting the parts. B'nai B'rith attempts to draw the circle which shall include Jewish life and hope and aspiration of World Israel. Visionary? Perhaps. True greatness, however, results from an ability to strive for the accomplishment of great things. All the great ideals may be attained, but that which is accomplished shall be great. The Jews particularly must remember that true nobility does not consist in being superior to someone else. True nobility consists in being superior to our former selves. B'nai B'rith aims to evolve this sort of true Jewish nobility.

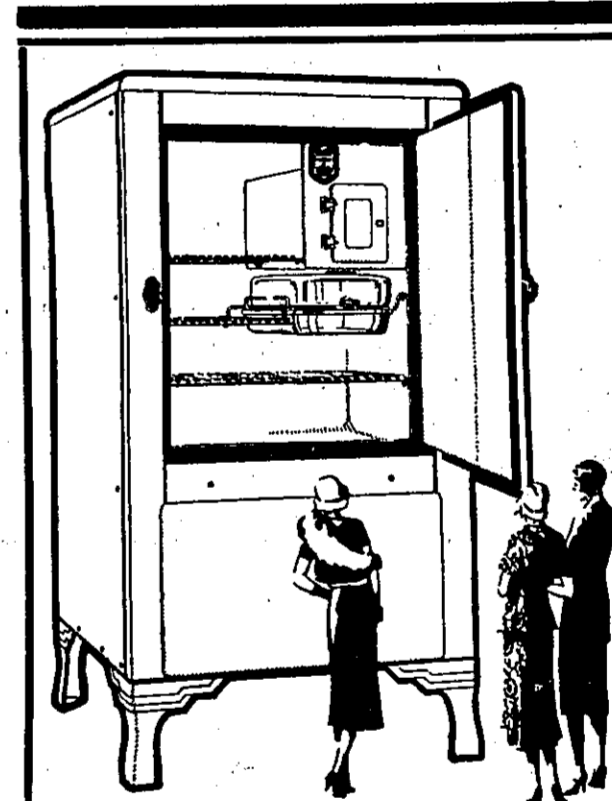
