acial settlement upon his wife in case of divorce, the husband thought twice and thrice before he might proceed with divorce action."

Rabbi Chiel pointed out that the Ketubah served exceedingly well its purposes for a long time. However, new problems have arisen for which provisions were not necessarily made in the ancient period.

Rabbi Chiel indicated that the new clause being inserted into the Ketubah by the Conservative Rabbinat was intended to correct this abuse. Husband and wife would have equal right to summon the other partner to a Bette Din (Jewish Court), a National Jewish Court of Domestic Relations, to consist of five members of the Jewish Theological Seminary and the Rabbinical Assembly.

Leaders in American Orthodoxy were approached by the leaders of American Conservatism to make common effort in this important Jewish area, but they replied with a cold refusal. Unfortunately, there has been an unwillingness to come to grips with Jewish religious problems. In fact, it can be said—and the charges can easily be corroborated—that certain Orthodox religious leaders have, alas, been tacit if not direct beneficiaries of the abuses in the areas of divorce, conversion, as well as in the realm of Kashrut.

Reuben Diamond, 70, of 145 Banerman avenue, resident of Winnipeg for 53 years, died Friday, Jan. 28, in St. Boniface hospital, following a brief illness.

Funeral services were held Sunday, 1 p.m., at the Chesed Shel Emes chapel, with Rabbi Dr. A. Kravetz officiating. Burial was made in the Shaarey Zedek cemetery.

Mr. Diamond was born in Voline, Russia, and came to Canada in 1902. He farmed for a time at Transcona, Man., and later operated a general store at Plum Coulee, Man. He returned to Winnipeg about 1910 and for many years was active in the real estate business. He retired several years ago.

Arriving in Winnipeg in 1902, when the organized Jewish community was in its infancy, the deceased played a prominent role in the affairs of the Tiferes Israel synagogue, and taught Tanaach for many years at the Talmud Torah. During the depression, he organized the committee to combat high
