She's a singer with the distinction of sounding like no one but herself which I hereby challenge. She's Fanny Brice all over again. Barbra is striking in appearance, possesses a lithe and supple body and has

extremely expressive hands and arms. Her haughty mien somewhat negates the character she created in "Wholesale."

If you caught the young lady on the Johnny Carson video, you'll agree she's given to waggish sayings and bizarre observations. My first impression was, "This gal's a kook."

Barbra is a mere 20. Even at that age, and despite the impressions she manages to create, she's nobody silly. She was graduated with honors from a Brooklyn high school at

16. She was rejected by her fellow students because she was a "loner."

In explanation, Barbra said, "I wasn't like anyone else." She strikes back at her homely features by emphasizing her conviction that "any beauty I am to display has to come from within."

Bernstein doesn't buy specialization. He created the eloquent, reverent score for "The Ten Commandments," the haunting, evocative theme for "To Kill a Mockingbird," the slinky, sexy accompaniment for prostitutes in "Walk on the Wild Side," the the drug addict's nightmare music in "Man with the Golden Arm."
